- Math, effective communication, & job-readiness training
- 2 weeks of monitored work placement with a local employer

WHAT IS A ROOFER?

A roofer is a skilled tradesperson who installs, repairs or replaces flat roofs as well as shingles, shakes or other roofing tiles on sloped roofs consisting of wood, steel or concrete. Roofers use many types of roofing equipment to perform their work, including overhead hoists, bobcats, asphalt kettles and conveyor belts. Strength, agility and a willingness to work in extreme weather conditions and at varying heights are the characteristics of the average roofer. Knowledge of the various types of roofing systems is also essential to a successful career in roofing.
